In recognition of this, various NATO nations established the CIMIC Center of Excellence (CCOE) NATO ten years ago with the scope, to fill the gap between the civilian side and the military side within any mission area. Besides training civilian and military actors for mutual interaction, CIMIC closely assess the impact of a military mission on the civil domain.

As already mentioned, the military are not acting alone in a crisis area, and they are not the only "tool in the toolbox" that can be used to solve a crisis. Therefore a good understanding of our civilian counterparts is necessary, in either combining resources, mitigating problems, sharing information or simply be aware of each other's goals and mandates.
